
Districtwide Instruction Moves to Four Days Per Week

Pardeeville students in grades 6-12 will be transitioning from the hybrid model of instruction to a 4-day/week model on **Monday, April 19**. Students attending inperson classes will be at school every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Wednesday will remain a virtual day of instruction districtwide. At that time all students who have opted for in-person instruction, grades 4K-12, will be attending in-person four days per week! The school district views this as great progress and steps in

the right direction.

We are excited to have our secondary students back for more in-person learning time, but acknowledge the significant change that this is for some students. We also acknowledge that this change will be a challenge for some students and families. We are committed to doing all that we can to make this a positive, productive, and safe school environment.

Superintendent Comments

It goes without saying that the 2020-21 school year has been different. However, as the school year enters the last two months, things that have been done in the past are starting to happen again with modifications.

The high school and middle school bands and choruses will put on concerts in the auditorium in May. Only family members will be able to attend, but it does give the students, especially the seniors, one more opportunity to perform in the Lenz Auditorium. There will be awards night in the High School and graduation as scheduled although the number of people who can attend will be limited.

There has been discussion about the 8th Grade Promotion and possibly 4K promotion and more information will be coming out about those activities. Unfortunately, the school guidelines for COVID-19 mean that there will be no Elementary School music program this spring.

Practice for baseball, softball, track, and golf begins on April 19 and the School District expects to complete those seasons. The Bulldog Stomp is scheduled for May 1, 2021. Plans are tentatively in place for the 8th Grade Washington D. C. trip to take place in July, if the sights reopen.

We have had an exciting month!

We have been working diligently with the Columbia County Health Department and Hometown Pharmacy of Pardeeville.

On March 17, 2021, the 1st dose of Pfizer COVID vaccinations were administered to 91 individuals here at school by Pardeeville Hometown Pharmacy. The Pharmacy was able to get enough vaccines to provide vaccinations to: administration, teachers, support staff, coaches, substitute teachers, CESA staff, student teachers, and bus drivers. The second dose will be given on April 7, 2021. A big "thank you" to all, for the many hours of hard work, to make this happen.

Many of our staff have also gotten immunized elsewhere and have kept us up to date on their vaccinations. We are very proud to say that everyone is working together for the safety of our students and staff. There was much jubilation on March 17th because it was a step in the right direction to relieve anxiety and give us all a better sense of control.

We continue to see COVID issues but it appears to be declining in our area. This is due to wearing our masks, keeping safe distance, good hand hygiene and now we can add vaccinations. Keep up the good work.

The second exciting news this month that is happening soon, PASD is planning a new program called **BRIDGING Brighter Smiles**. This is a School-Based Dental Program. Free dental cleanings, sealants and several other services will be offered to **All** students in school. Stay tuned for further updates.

Congratulations to Senior Isabelle Read, the recipient of the \$10,000 Herb Kohl Initiative Scholarship.

Each year, the Herb Kohl Initiative Scholarship selects 100 different high schools for the Initiative Scholarship. The selection of schools is based on a seven-year rotation cycle, which allows every high school in Wisconsin to receive an Initiative Scholarship every seven years.

The intent of the Initiative

Scholarship is to recognize students who are putting forth extraordinary effort to do their best in the classroom and have overcome significant obstacles or adversity.

Bucky's Tuition Promise



First announced in February 2018, Bucky's Tuition Promise is a commitment to Wisconsin resident students.

The program guarantees scholarships and grants to pay for tuition & segregated fees for students whose household adjusted gross income (AGI) is \$60,000 or less. Incoming freshmen will receive eight (8) consecutive semesters (4 years) of free tuition & segregated fees and transfer students will receive four (4) semesters (2 years). School District Awarded TEACH Grant

Recently, Department of Administration (DOA) Secretary Joel Brennan announced 141 Wisconsin school districts and libraries will receive nearly \$3 million in 2021 Technology for Educational ACHievement (TEACH) Information Technology Infrastructure grants. Pardeeville applied for this grant and will be receiving \$25,800! The TEACH Information Technology Infrastructure grants awarded to Pardeeville Area School District will be used to supplement the following eRate projects that were applied for and are pending approval: upgrade wireless access points for all 3 schools, upgrade outdated (1998) network cabling in the West end of the high school. The MS and east side of the HS were updated with E-rate funding and district funds last year, and upgrade the district internet firewall.

"These infrastructure grants will help rural communities improve educational accessibility for their residents, which ultimately benefits our entire state," said Secretary Brennan. "I am proud that Governor Tony Evers and his Administration are supporting these important and ongoing efforts."



Mr. Knitt said the elementary school was shut down for a period of time and reopened on 1/27/2021. One elementary classroom will be off now for 14 days. COVID vaccines for school staff should be available beginning March 1st. Our school nurses have contacted Walgreens to get on the list to have them come and administer COVID shots to our school staff. Discussions should be held to decide whether we should have school on the days of the shots and, if we can only have part of the staff immunized at a time, how would we prioritize who would get the shots first. Mr. Knitt said our school would be willing to be a vaccination post if needed. He said most of the schools in the Trailways Conference are planning to hold graduation but they are struggling with decisions about prom. Mr. LeMay has talked with seniors and juniors about the prom and he will be doing a survey to see what their preferences are. Mr. Dustin Hoffmann, youth boys' club basketball coach, said the club appreciates being able to practice at Pardeeville, but he asked the Board now to consider allowing other teams to come here to play games instead of having to travel to play their games elsewhere. Administrative Team Reports

Ms. Kamrath submitted a report on the Elementary School. She will be meeting this month with all summary teachers to talk about their Student Learning Objectives and Professional Practice Goals. Virtual parent/ teacher conferences are scheduled for 2/18/21. Ms. Kamrath attended the virtual Elementary Principal Conferences on February 4 & 5. Four-year-old kindergarten registration is being held virtually due to COVID. Three students will be doing their student teaching at Pardeeville Elementary school this quarter. Ms. Kamrath is working on scheduling the Forward Exam testing. She is working on the enrichment summer school program, is contacting the Village of Pardeeville to continue the Summer Park Program, and is working with the Pardeeville Public Library to work on connecting our park program with the summer story hour.

Mr. Bell provided a report on the Middle School. Virtual parent/teacher conferences will be held on 2/18/21. Administrators met with Courtney Sturtevant to discuss procedures for the upcoming Forward Exam. Contact is being made with families of students who are failing to complete work, both virtually and in-person, hoping that between the remainder of the school year and summer school that these students are prepared for their next level. Good progress is being seen in a high percentage of the 22 middle school students in the 100% virtual program. With assistance from PowerSchool, some adjustments have been made to our standards-based grading program to best represent students' level of understanding and skill and what has been learned over the past three years is being used to assist the 8th grade team to implement grading for learning next year.

Mr. LeMay provided a report on the High School. February is Career and Technical Education (CTE) month recognizing Agri-Science/FFA, Business & Information Technology/FBLA, Health Careers, and Technology Education/ SkillsUSA. PHS was unable to host the annual Job/Career Fair this year. Crystal Huset, counselor, made scheduling presentations to grades 9-11 for the 2021-22 school year. She also worked on four-year course plans with freshmen. Students will start registering the end of February. Statewide ACT testing will occur on 3/9/21. All juniors need to be tested. Virtual parent/teacher conferences are 2/18/21. Principals worked on an addendum to the Bulldog Blueprint and also on the 2021-22 school calendar. Options are being looked at for the Cancer Run/Walk scheduled for 5/1/21. Mr. LeMay met with juniors and seniors to talk about options for prom and students were given a survey to gauge their interests.

Ms. McElroy gave a Technology Department update. Sixty-six tech MOJO tickets were solved during the last month and 58 new tickets were received. Ms. McElroy contacted vendors for E-Rate bids, did walk throughs, created maps and documents for scope of projects. She set up testing servers and software for ACT, Forward and ELL testing. A camera at the Elementary School had to be replaced due to water damage. Ms. McElroy provided a report that shows the number of chromebooks that are in use for students and staff and it also shows how many chromebooks will be "end

of life" within 12 months or less. The school uses a software tool that helps update large groups of chromebooks quickly vs. updating each chromebook record one at a time.

There were 155 chromebooks purchased to replace chromebooks that will be end of life September 2021.

Mr. Housner submitted a Buildings and Grounds report listing work done in the custodial/

maintenance department, some of which included: Replaced the ceiling tiles and carpet in the vestibule by door #3 at the elementary school due to water damage, painted the walls and stripped and waxed the floor in the reading room at the elementary school due to water damage, shampooed all carpets in the high school and middle school, did routine and preventive maintenance, completed 54 work orders, etc. GAPPA replaced the main power supply for door 14 outside doors. Johnson Controls completed yearly boiler inspections. CESA 10 performed their Environmental, Health and Safety visit, and bloodborne pathogen and PPE hazards assessment.

Mr. Hammerschmidt, Activities Director, submitted a report. He updated the Board on the status of winter sports. The WIAA Board of Control will vote on 3/5/21 for our Football Conference realignment starting in the fall of 2022. WIAA spring sport guidelines should be published soon to give us guidance on how our spring seasons will operate. We will be running all of our normally scheduled spring sports. Some athletic webpages have been updated and more need updating. The football/track scoreboard will hopefully be replaced this spring/summer. Athletic record board and display cases are on hold.

Committee Reports

Mr. Knitt gave an update on Coronavirus. Two elementary classrooms have been out on quarantine. One of the sports teams had possible exposure with a player from another team that tested positive. The nursing staff is struggling with how to get staff vaccinated with Walgreens and other locations not getting enough vaccine. We need to make a list of staff that would be the highest priority to get shots first. The school may receive additional ESSER funds to help pay for some of our

COVID related expenses.

Board Comments and Questions

Mr. Kath asked if the boys' club request to hold games at the school could be approved sooner than the March 1st meeting. Mr. Knitt will check with Mr. Housner about this request. Mr. Kath said there is a new group of people in charge of the Hall of Fame and they would like to see the contract that was previously put together.
